She believed in the biblical principle of "spare the rod and spoil the child", a factor well known by her children and everyone in the community, that if you were Thelma Parnell's child, "you'd better behave yourself or else"!! and you did!!

In addition, Thelma Naomi Parnell was a physician who healed the hurts of others, particularly children, with a hug, a kiss and band-aid when necessary.

She was an attorney, who could mediate differences amiably and have even enemies speaking to one another with a new found respect. She was also bold and fearless. She could speak her mind and wasn't afraid to share with anyone exactly what she thought of a situation. *S. Parnell*

She was a teacher who shared her wisdom with others in many ways, especially young girls who needed the guidance, direction and benefit of old-fashioned mother-wit and good common sense.

She was a friend to everyone, and she quickly developed a rapport with all people, regardless of their station in life. Thelma Parnell, without any urging or pressure applied to others, enjoyed free home delivery of juice, fish, eggs, vegetables and numerous other services because she enjoyed people and they simply enjoyed her. *S. Her legacy is one of devotion, commitment, and abiding love to others. Following the death of her second oldest daughter, Pat, Thelma adopted Pat's then 11 year-old son, Little Jonathan. With her own children practically out of the nest, every effort was undertaken to ensure that Jonathan would also receive the very best that she could offer. She refused to shrink from her responsibility.

Once again Thelma Naomi Parnell proved that she was well fitted for the task. She nurtured, encouraged, applauded, complimented, and corrected her budding youngest son. Despite changing times and a social mind-set that dictated that her methods were out-dated, Thelma Parnell remained undaunted and gave her all to ensure Jonathan's success. For her efforts, she was well rewarded and greatly blessed with yet another well trained, mannerable, educated, respectable, clean-cut young man thus quickly evoking the affirmation, "you must be Mrs. Parnell's son".

Thelma Naomi Parnell loved her home of worship, namely Messiah Baptist Church. She was active as a member of the Senior Choir, where she served faithfully over the years.

In March of 1991, she became seriously ill and was hospitalized. She was released in early April and was recuperating well, but for reasons known only to God, she was called from labor to reward on Tuesday, May 14, 1991 at 12:40 p.m.

She leaves to rejoice in her memory: Six sons, Jim, Joseph, Rodney, John, David and Jonathan; Three daughters, Dorothy, Eleanor and Elaine; Four daughters-in-law; One son-in-law; Three sisters, Roberta Johnson, Irma Lee Faison and Nevada Williams; Thirty grandchildren; Three great grandchildren and a great host of neices, nephews, cousins and many many friends

Thelma Naomi Eugenia Clark-Parnell was born on November 8, 1916 in Fernandina Beach, Florida. She was the third eldest of six children born to the late John Clark and Sallie Byrd.

Thelma was educated in the Parochial schools of Fernandina Beach and enjoyed reading and teaching others. Thelma was raised in a Christian home and, as a result, she accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as her personal Savior at the early age of eleven. Shortly thereafter, she united with the Episcopal Church in Fernandina Beach, Florida.

As she matured in wisdom and stature, her steps were ordered by the Lord; a fact that was very evident in all areas of her life and especially in her selection of a husband.

This very beautiful woman of Indian and African-American origin, met a unique man. He was strong, tall, handsome, godly and wise. The late Joseph N. Parnell, Sr., was an excellent husband, provider and father. To this union, the Lord gave 13 children; five of whom preceeded her in death as did her beloved husband following 28-1/2 years of marriage.

Life for Thelma Naomi Parnell has always been filled with challenges. She could have easily opted to pursue other interests; however, she loved her career as a wife and mother.

She was an early riser, who read the word of God, communed with the Lord and received divine directions for each day.

She was an excellent cook who prepared numerous meals, washed and ironed clothes, maintained a home, planted gardens, nursed her children, read bedtime stories, and walked the floor of her home praying many nights for her household as they slept.

Determined to train her children in the ways of the Lord, Thelma made sure that the word of God was read aloud in her home. She took her children to church, and Sunday School was an absolute must. This was fairly simple due to the fact that the Messiah Baptist Church was, at that time, located approximately one quarter of a block away. It was through her efforts that everyone of her children met the Lord and became members of Messiah which greatly enhanced their lives.

To the community, as well as her family, Thelma Naomi Parnell was a tremendous lady. She not only sent her children to school, but she was actively involved in the educational process at three different Detroit public schools. She attended Parent Teacher Conferences, making her presence known, and later served as the President of the P.T.A. She attended numerous evening school programs and assisted the local school community agents whenever possible. She demanded excellence from her children and she got it. Everything else was unacceptable!!

She never missed a Honors Program or any Special Program that involved her children or grandchildren, nor did she resist correcting them when it became necessary, even if it meant the use of corporal punishment!!
