## Obituary

Al, as most people knew him, made an impression on his instructors while attending the public schools of the county. Growing up in a christian home, he joined Oak Hill Methodist Church at an early age. He served in the U.S. Army with a tour of duty in Germany. Received an honorable discharge.

Returning home, Al went back to school under the G. I. Bill to become a tailor and later an electrician. He was employed by Gilman Paper Company for many years. He was a member of the American Legion, Post 511. He made many friends in the community and on the job.

He was married to the late Geraldine T. Ealey on June 28, 1953. They were blessed with 3 children, 1 of whom preceeded him in death — Marcus Luther. Al was the father of 4 children.
