

Life's Story

THE EARLY YEARS | Deacon James Edward Dawson, Sr. was born August 29, 1936 in the Greenville Community. He was the first-born child to his parents, the late Brother Roosevelt Dawson, Sr. and the late Sister Vernie Lee Pearson-Dawson. During his childhood, Deacon Dawson often reminisced of working in his father's field and attending to the family's cattle. Also, Deacon Dawson recalled memories of playing with siblings, cousins, and friends from the neighborhood.

Deacon Dawson was educated in Camden County Schools and graduated from Ralph J. Bunche High School in 1956. As a student at Ralph Bunche, Deacon Dawson exhibited his athletic prowess on the Hornets' football team. Following high school graduation, Deacon Dawson enlisted in the United States Army. He trained at Fort Jackson in Columbia, South Carolina. Also, Deacon Dawson served a tour of duty at Fort Hood, Texas.

WORK | Gilman Paper Company was Deacon Dawson "occupational get-a-way"; he toiled arduously at the company for 40 years. Deacon Dawson spent the majority of his career in Gilman's wood yard operating machines like the stacker. A dedicated employee, Deacon Dawson received perfect attendance honors for several years. He understood the value of hard-work and modeled this behavior to his children. One of his favorite quotes was, "A man who doesn't work, will starve."

CHURCH LIFE | Reverence of the Almighty God was implanted in Deacon Dawson's heart from an early age. Deacon Dawson attended Zion Sisters Missionary Baptist Church in the Greenville Community, under the tutelage of the late Rev. Bethel Strickland. In adult years, Deacon Dawson joined New Mt. Carmel Baptist Church in Gross, Florida.

He was ordained a deacon by the late Rev. Dr. Delores Holmes, and he was dedicated to the works of the ministry. He was appointed Chairman of the Deacon's Board and Church Trustee Board. Like his dedication to his career, Deacon Dawson was passionate about his role as laborer in Christ. One would always see Deacon Dawson encouraging the youth to advance in education or ill members about God's healing touch. His favorite hymn was "Father I Stretch My Hands to Thee." Deacon Dawson graciously worked alongside his wife and pastor, Sr. Apostle Christena Dawson in handling church affairs until his health caused him to transition.

FAMILY LIFE | Love filled the air in the fall of 1965, when he met and fell in love with Apostle Christena Brown-Dawson. Deacon Dawson embraced Apostle Dawson's family, for she was guardian to her four younger sisters, Delores Brown-Holmes, Alice Brown, Jacquelyn Brown-Coleman, and Shyrel Brown-Mack, a nephew, Antonio Tyson; and her children, Dallice Douglas-Mitchell, Flossie Douglas-Eakins, and William Douglas. In June 1967, the

love birds married. The following year, Deacon and Apostle Dawson welcomed a son, James, Jr. Six years later, a baby girl Ivy, was born.

Deacon Dawson transitioned from this life on May 31, 2012 at UF and Shand's Hospital in Jacksonville, Florida. He leaves to cherish his memories his loving wife of 44 years Christena.
