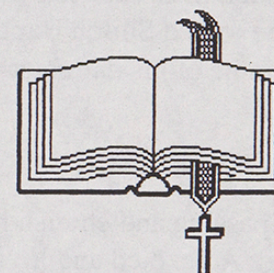

Obituary

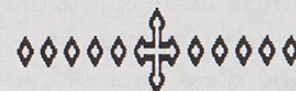
