Obituary

Brother Joe Johnson was born November 6, 1910 in Camden County, Tarboro, Ga. He was the eldest son of the late Adeline and Alee Johnson. His two brothers David and James preceeded him in death.

He fell in love with Catherine A. Austell and they were married on Feb. 23, 1929. To this union two sons were born Nathaniel and Ortis.

In 1936, he moved his family to New Jersey where they lived until they relocated to Cleveland, Ohio. He served in the Army from Feb. 9, 1944 to Jan. 18, 1946. When he returned from the service he became employed at J. & L. Steel Mill in Cleveland, Ohio. He worked there until he became disabled. While in Cleveland, he joined Lee's Memorial A.M.E. Church under the Rev. Wesley I. Reed. There he served until his health failed.

In June 1990, he moved to Brunswick, Ga. He then joined Brown's Chapel A.M.E. Church. Due to poor health, he was unable to attend regularly.

He departed this life Saturday, November 2, 1996 at 6:00 P.M. at Southeast Regional Hospital, Brunswick, Ga.

He leaves to mourn a loving and devoted wife, Catherine A. Austell. Two sons: Nathaniel Johnson (Shirley) of Brunswick, Ga., Ortis Johnson (Lillie) of Cleveland, Ohio.
