OBITUARY

The final chapter of a beautiful life for Rebecca Armstrong Mitchell came to an earthly end on Thursday, August 7, 1997 at Saint Luke Mayo Hospital in Jacksonville, Florida. Born in Camden County on May 9, 1914, she was the fifth child of the late Saint Luke and Cornelia Scipio Armstrong.

She attended the Schools of Camden County and the Selden Normal Industrial Institute of Brunswick, Georgia. She graduated from Savannah State College in 1950 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Elementary Education. At the age of seventeen, Mrs. Mitchell started teaching at Rough and Ready Elementary School and Scarlet Elementary School in Camden County, Georgia. From there she went on to O.F. Edwards Elementary and then to Kingsland Elementary where she retired after forty-seven years of service. Her motto was "All Children Are Special." Mrs. Mitchell taught first grade for all forty-seven years of her teaching career.

Mrs. Mitchell was a life-long member of Hamilton Chapel United Methodist Church. She served faithfully in her Church in many capacities, including finance secretary, class leader, secretary of the Charge Conference, and communion steward.

She will be remembered most for her role within her family. She was the matriarch who raised and nurtured her children, and the children of her siblings with kindness, patience, and understanding. She was a creative force at home, as well as in the community, and she touched lives in a meaningful way.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Mr. Nathaniel Mitchell; three brothers: Mr. Early Armstrong, Mr. Theodore Armstrong and Mr. William Armstrong, Sr., and one son, Mr. Donald Mitchell.

She leaves to cherish her precious memory; a son, Mr. Marlyn O. Mitchell of Woodbine, Georgia; three sisters: Mrs. Elsie Robinson and Mrs. Agnes Chester both of Jacksonville, Florida, and Edna Cynthia Armstrong of Woodbine, Georgia; and many nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends, including a special friend, Dr. Bruce Mitchell.
