The final chapter of a beautiful life for **Edna Cynthia Armstrong** came to an early end on Saturday, May 8, 1999 at Camden County Medical Center in Kingsland, Georgia. Born in Camden County, Georgia on April 7, 1918, she was the youngest child of the late Saint Luke and Cornelia Scipio Armstrong.

She attended the schools of Camden County, Georgia, and the Selden Normal Institute of Brunswick, Georgia. She graduated from Savannah State College, Savannah, Georgia in 1939, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education. She graduated from Penn State University in 1960 with a Masters Degree. Miss Armstrong was a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., and she was a retiree of the Camden County School System.

Miss Armstrong was a member of the Widow's Chapel United Methodist Church, and later joined Hamilton Chapel United Methodist Church. She served faithfully in her church in many capacities, including Secretary, Class Leader, Choir, and served on numerous boards under the Old Savannah District.

She will be remembered most for her role within her family, as well as, in the community, and she touched lives in a meaningful way.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by three brothers: Mr. Early Armstrong, Mr. Theodore Armstrong and Mr. William Armstrong, Sr., and two sisters: Mrs. Elsie Robinson and Mrs. Rebecca Mitchell.
