Sis. Cora Mae Baker was born April 16, 1921 in the Kinlaw Community to the late Chester Arthur Holzendorf and Bessie Wade Holzendorf.

She joined the church at an early age under the pastorage of Rev. Malachi Way. She served faithfully as president of the Usher Board and Senior Choir. She also served as treasurer of the Minister's Wives Auxilliary, a member of the Mission Board and Choir #3 of Evergreen Baptist Church. She was also a member of Mt. Carmel Baptist Missionary Association Union, Gross, Fla.

She received her education in the public schools of Camden County, and received a paraprofessional certificate from Brunswick Junior College.

She later met and married the late Rev. Walter Brown Baker, June 19, 1937. They resided in Gross, Fla. from 1937 to 1946, and later moved to Kingsland, Ga. This union was blessed with four children. One son preceded her in death.
