

However, he made it explicitly clear that his most cherished award is the plaque presented to him by the Hearing Impaired Class at Mary Lee Clark Middle School in 1990, at the end of his assignment as Principal there. They thanked him for being that "SOMEONE ELSE."

He is survived by his mother, Mrs. Rebecca A. Mitchell and one brother, Mr. Marlon Othello Mitchell. Four aunts: Elsie L. Robinson of Jacksonville, FL; Jessie Mitchell of Bronx, NY; Agnes Chester of Jacksonville, FL; Edna C. Armstrong of Woodbine, GA; and one uncle, Homer Chester of Jacksonville, FL. A host of other relatives and friends mourn the passing of this great man.

Donald Mitchell was a very special individual who was loved and cherished by many. He gave himself unreservedly to his family, his church, and his community.

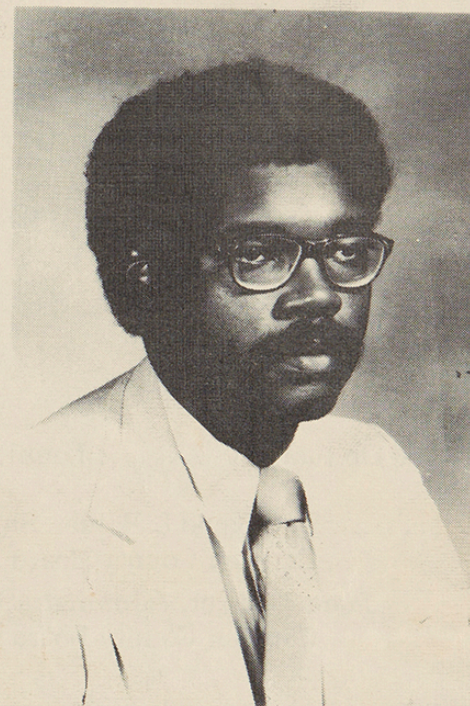

OBITUARY

Mr. Donald Mitchell was born July 16, 1951, in Jacksonville, Florida. He was the youngest child of the late Mr. Nathaniel Mitchell and Mrs. Rebecca A. Mitchell.

He was a member of Hamilton Chapel United Methodist Church where he served until his demise. He served in many capacities in the Local, District, and Annual Conferences of the Church. Some of them were: Chairman of the Administrative Board, Chorister, Liturgist, Trustee, Sunday School teacher, Finance Committee, and in many other places where needed. He was President of the Kingsland Sub-District, a member of the Committee on District Superintendency, District Trustee of the Waycross District, and he served on the Conference Finance Committee.

He was educated in the public schools of Camden County. He graduated from Ralph J. Bunche High School in 1969 as an Honor Graduate. He was also awarded the perfect attendance award for attending school every day for twelve years. He received his Bachelor's Degree in Science from Tuskegee Institute now Tuskegee University. He received his Masters Degree and Specialist Degree in Supervision and Administration from Valdosta State College. He was a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated; Georgia Association of Educators; Association for Curriculum Development; State and National Association of Curriculum Directors; and many other professional, civic, and fraternal organizations.

He served as high school science teacher, Assistant Principal of Camden County High School, Principal of Mary Lee Clark Middle School, and he was presently serving as Curriculum Director for Secondary Education, Camden County Board of Education, Kingsland, Georgia.

He was elected City Councilman of Woodbine, Georgia. He also was a diligent volunteer fireman, emergency medical technician, Chairman of the Kings Bay Impact Coordinating Committee, President of the District Funeral Practitioners, Funeral Director of Whittaker Funeral Homes, partner in M and D Mitchell's Corporation (a commercial bus service), and a member of the Camden County Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Advisory Council.

During his lifetime, Donald Mitchell has received numerous awards and citations. In Education, he has acclaimed honors as a student and as an educator. He was named Teacher of the Year during his tenure.

He has received plaques, certificates, resolutions, and trophies for his contributions to Local, State, and National affairs. Much recognition was earned during his years in education (1973-1992), his terms as Mayor of Woodbine (1981-1989), and as Chairman of the Kings Bay Impact Coordinating Committee (Chairman 1986-1989).

The Athletic Booster Club, Science Club, Student Council, Vocational Club, and Teachers of Camden County High School have all recognized Mr. Mitchell during his years there. KBICC commemorated his services on March 14, 1990, with a Certificate of Appreciation and a RESOLUTION.
