## OBITUARY

Mrs. Arnetta B. Campbell was born November 23, 1920 to Arline Kiel Bell and the late Mann Bell in Clarke County, Alabama. She departed this life February 19, 1997.

She married the late Artley Campbell in 1942. She joined the First African Baptist Church and worked faithfully as officer and member. She was a member of the Heroines of Jericho, P.H.A., Lady Esther Court #3, the Order of Golden Circle, William West Assembly #302, and Camden County Chapter No. 191 of the Order of the Eastern Star.

Mrs. Campbell was educated in the Clarke County School System, Clarke County, Alabama and received her undergraduate degree from Savannah State College, Savannah, Georgia. It was during Mrs. Campbell's undergraduate studies she made a commitment to the development of children. She served as an educator in both Charlton and Camden County school systems. After leaving the public school system she instituted the first black-owned child care facility in the area with state licensing. She acted as owner and director of the ABC Development Center for eighteen years.

Her accomplishments as an entrepreneur began in the 1940's, when she owned one of the first black business to receive licensing in St. Marys, Georgia. She owned and operated Neta's Soda Shoppe in the building which presently houses Camden County Tribune.

Mrs. Campbell's civic affiliations include membership in the Camden County Black Business Association, Incorporated; Camden/Kings Bay Area Chamber of Commerce; National Association of Female Executives; National Association for the Advancement of Colored People; the Democratic National Committee; and "Americans for Change" Presidential Task Force.

Survivors include her mother, Arline Bell of Mobile, Alabama; an aunt - Margie Stovall of Vallejo, California; a sister - Betty Lambert of Mobile, Alabama; brother - Aaron E. Bell of Mobile, Alabama; brothers-in-law - Leconia Campbell of San Diego, California, Irvin and Walter Campbell both of St. Marys, Georgia; two daughters - Evelyn Stephens of Miami, Florida and Shirley Spears of Savannah, Georgia; nine grandchildren, nine great-grandchildren; nieces; nephews; relatives and friends.
