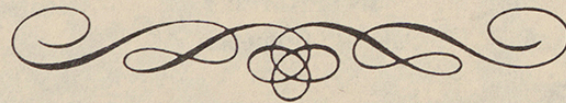

This comes to all."

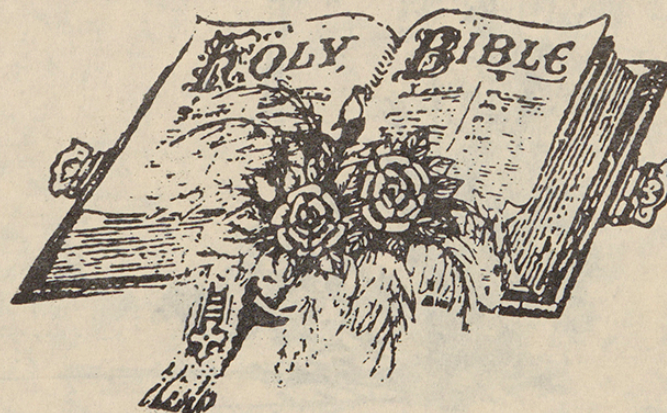
On August 30, 1990, the sweet spirit of
